Dec. 8 – Titus Dec. 15 – Philemon

The letter to Philemon was written during Paul's first Roman imprisonment (60-62 AD) around the same time that he wrote Ephesians and Colossians. (All three letters are delivered by Tychicus.) It is addressed to Philemon, Apphia (possibly Philemon's wife), Archippus (possibly Philemon's son) and to the church that met in Philemon's home (in or near Colosse.) Paul is writing to tell Philemon that his slave, Onesimus, who had run away, came to Paul (while Paul was in chains) and has become a Christian. In the letter he asks Philemon to receive Onesimus back "no longer as a slave, but better than a slave, as a dear brother" (v. 16) "Onesimus" means "useful" and was a common name for slaves. Paul uses a play on words when he writes, "Formerly he was useless to you, but now he had become useful both to you and to me." (v. 17) Slavery was widespread in the Roman Empire. (Over a third of the population were slaves.) Slaves could serve their masters as doctors, musicians, teachers, artists, accountants as well as household and field laborers. But, slaves were not legally considered persons and could be bought, sold, inherited, exchanged or seized to pay their master's debt and their masters held the power of a slave's life or death in their hands. In contrast, the principles of freedom and equality are taught clearly in Scripture: Each person has been created in the image of God and has been given worth and value by God; (Genesis 1:26-27, 9:6, Matthew 10:29-31; 25:40) In Christ we are truly set free: (John 8:32; Galatians 5:1, 13) The blood of Christ breaks down all divisions - there is "neither slave nor free... for you are all one in Christ Jesus." (Galatians 3:28) Rather than attacking the institution of slavery directly (which would have resulted in brutally suppressed slave insurrections, social upheaval, and jeopardized the spread of the gospel) Christianity undermines the evils of slavery by seeking to change the hearts of both slaves and masters. The letter to Philemon gives evidence of this change and compliments Paul's instructions to both slaves and masters. (Ephesians 6:5-9; Colossians 3:22 - 4:1) Without using the word forgiveness, the letter beautifully illustrates what forgiveness looks like. Paul is willing to make restitution for whatever Onesimus owes. We are reminded that Jesus paid the tremendous debt we each owed. He can set us free. restore relationships, and give us life that is truly life.
