Tell Us More About THE BOOK OF DANIEL



The stories in the Book of Daniel take place between 605 and 535 BC with prophecies that extend far into the future. **Daniel** remained faithful to God while

serving in both the Babylonian and the Persian Empires. Below is a brief description of the rulers of the Babylonian Empire during Daniel's ministry.

- **Nebuchadnezzar** was the longest-reigning (605-562) BC) and most powerful monarch of the Babylonian Empire. After defeating both Assyria and Egypt he makes Judah a vassal state and eventually destroys the Temple and the city of Jerusalem (586 BC) taking the people of Judah to Babylon as captives. He is remembered for his expansive and elaborate building projects including the Hanging Gardens. The Greek historian Herodotus wrote that the walls of Babylon were so thick that chariot races were held on top of them. The city inside the walls occupied an area of 200 square miles, roughly the size of Chicago today. In Daniel 1-4 we see how God reveals Himself to Nebuchadnezzar and how his heart was changed by those encounters. Daniel 4 is written by Nebuchadnezzar and contains his testimony.
- —Amel-Marduk (562-560 BC), Nebuchadnezzar's son, is mentioned in Jeremiah 52:31 & 2 Kings 25:27 as the king who releases Jehoiachin from prison. The historian Berossus tells us that Amel-Marduk was deposed and murdered for conducting himself in an "improper manner."
- —Neriglissar (560-556 BC), Nebuchadnezzar's son in law, is mentioned in Jeremiah 39:13 as one of Nebuchadnezzar's high ranking officers. His campaigns in Syria and Phoenicia successfully maintained Babylonian rule in these regions. A palace built by Neriglissar has been discovered at Babylon.
- —**Labashi-Marduk** (556 BC) was the young son of Neriglissar and the grandson of Nebuchadnezzar. He is murdered in the ninth month of his reign.
- —Nabonidus (556-539 BC), the last king of the Babylonian Empire, lived in the Arabian oasis of Tayma for many years leaving his son, Belshazzar to rule from Babylon. Belshazzar is the ruler in Daniel 5 who receives the "handwriting on the wall" from God about the end of the Babylonian Empire. A fragment of "The Prayer of Nabonidus" was among the Dead Sea Scrolls. "The Nabonidus Chronicle" inscribed on clay tablets is in the British Museum's collection.

THE NAME "BETHEL"

In Genesis 28:19, Jacob names the place where he had an encounter with God "Bethel" which means "House of God." Our church had several names in its early years including the Church of Christ at Jamey's Creek & Shackleford's Meeting House. Our membership chose the name "Bethel" in 1798 and kept that name until 1911. We were the host location for 23 consecutive meetings of the Bethel Association. Formed in 1789 Bethel Association was one of the earliest Baptist Associations in SC. Because we became the regular meeting place for these meetings, the church decided to adopt the name "Bethel."

For the first 90 years of our church's history, white & black members worshipped together in separate sections of the different meeting houses. In 1877, black members of our church who were interested in organizing their own church withdrew their membership and held their first meetings under a brush arbor on land given to them by A. B. Woodruff. Our church gave its blessings to these meetings and assisted in erecting the new church's first structure near the brush arbor site. The new church was called "New Bethel."

In 1913, W. A. Anderson requested that the building our church met in from 1849-1911 be used to "begin a work for the benefit of the mill people." It was called "Old Bethel" and used as a meeting place for the new church & as a school. In 1935 a new building was constructed on Gray Street & called Mills Mill Baptist Church. In 1994 the church changed their name to Cornerstone Baptist. The church moved into a new meeting house at its present location on 221 in 2005.

Bethel Cemetery, our church's cemetery, was the location of our first 5 meeting houses. It is the resting place for 7 men who fought in the Revolutionary War including Joseph Woodruff as well as for his son, Thomas Woodruff, for whom the City of Woodruff (1874) is named. The land (12 acres) for the church's early meeting houses & cemetery was conveyed to us by Joseph Woodruff after we were incorporated in 1804. Joseph Woodruff is listed as a deacon in our earliest church record, September 16, 1787.




