ZECHARIAH: THE LORD REMEMBERS

A New Verse by Verse Bible Study
Beginning Next Wednesday, July 6 * 6:00 pm
Fellowship Hall

Plan to be with us as we dive deeply into God's word. Zechariah's prophecies begin in 520 BC. Like Haggai, Zechariah challenges the people to leave their indifference behind & begin building the temple again. The Book of Zechariah, a combination of poetry, prose & apocalyptic literature, has more messianic references than any prophetic book except Isaiah. It is quoted or alluded to 71 times in the New Testament. In each of its three major sections, the prophet begins by addressing the people of his own time & then moves ahead to the time of the Messiah & the Messianic Kingdom. The apocalyptic sections describe encounters with visions, signs, celestial visitors & the voice of God. The name "Zechariah" means, "The LORD remembers" and his prophecies remind a people still downtrodden by foreign powers that the LORD remembers His covenant promises & will restore and bless. Jesus is called "My Servant the Branch" (3:8); "A Priest on His Throne" (6:13); and the One "Whom They Pierced" (12:10). He tells us that the Christ who makes salvation possible will be both humble (lowly & riding on a donkey, 9:9) and triumphant.

The deadline for nominations is **next Sunday, July 10.** To be eligible for election to the office of deacon, a person must: (1) be a member of this church, and (2) have been a member of this church for a minimum of one year prior to election, and (3) be twenty one years of age or older, and (4) not be a paid staff member, and (5) not have served as an active deacon for the past twelve months. Those who are currently serving and those who are rotating off as deacons are **not** eligible for election.

Duties of Deacons: The duties and qualifications of the deacons shall be those prescribed by the New Testament in Acts 6:1-8 and 1 Timothy 3:8-13.

- They shall constitute an advisory council in all matters relating to the business affairs of this church and
- Shall assist the pastor in the discharge of his pastoral duties
- They shall receive reports from the various officers and departments of the church, carefully considering such reports, making such recommendations and suggestions as they may deem judicious and for the best interest of the church.
- They shall be specifically charged with the administering of the Lord's Supper,
- With keeping the membership enlisted in the full program of the church, and
- With promoting peace, harmony and the spirit of cooperation among the membership.
- They shall furthermore serve as a committee of discipline, exercising a special watch-care over the members of the church, and
- Under the leadership of the pastor, make special effort to maintain spiritual harmony and righteous living among the membership of this church.


