WALKING THROUGH THE BIBLE

Wednesdays * 6:00 pm Fellowship Hall

Join us for Bible study. We live stream the study for those who are not able to be with us in person. It can be viewed live a little after 6:00 pm on Wednesdays or afterward at a time of your convenience. We will not meet on Wednesday, June 30 so that we can be part of the VBS Celebration.

July 7 – Haggai July 14 – Zechariah

The Book of Haggai is a collection of four prophecies that the prophet Haggai received from the LORD in 520 BC, the same year that marked the beginning of Zechariah's prophecies. Ezra 4 – 6 gives us the historical background for these books. Haggai urges the people, who had returned to Judah after being exiled in Babylon, to begin work again on the LORD's temple. After the foundations had been laid in 538 BC the work had been halted. The temple's ruins were symbolic of the spiritual condition of the former exiles who had become preoccupied with their own interests and had neglected their relationship with God. Haggai tells them that the Desire of All Nations will come and that the glory of the new temple will be greater than the old temple. These words were fulfilled in the time of Jesus. Haggai refers to Zerubabel, the governor, as being chosen by God as His signet ring. Zerubabel, from the line of David is an ancestor of Jesus. The writer of the Book of Hebrews (Hebrews 12:26) quotes Haggai 2:6 to help us understand that we are receiving a Kingdom that cannot be shaken.

Zechariah's prophecies begin in 520 BC & continue for an undetermined number of years. Like Haggai, Zechariah challenges the people to leave their indifference behind & begin building the temple again. The Book of Zechariah, a combination of poetry, prose & apocalyptic literature, has more messianic references than any prophetic book except Isaiah. It is quoted or alluded to 71 times in the New Testament. In each of its three major sections, the prophet begins by addressing the people of his own time & then moves ahead to the time of the Messiah & the Messianic Kingdom. The apocalyptic sections describe encounters with visions, signs, celestial visitors & the voice of God. The name "Zechariah" means, "The LORD remembers" and his prophecies remind a people still downtrodden by foreign powers that the LORD remembers His covenant promises & will restore and bless. Jesus is called "My Servant the Branch" (3:8); "A Priest on His Throne" (6:13); and the One "Whom They Pierced" (12:10). He tells us that the Christ who makes salvation possible will be both humble (lowly & riding on a donkey, 9:9) and triumphant. Jesus tells us in Matthew 23:35 / Luke 11:51 that Zechariah was murdered by the people between the sanctuary of the temple and the altar.


