June 9 – Nahum June 16 – Habakkuk

The Book of Habakkuk is a dialogue between Habakkuk and God. Habakkuk complains and God replies. "Habakkuk" means "to embrace" or "to wrestle." Habakkuk wrestles with God before he finally is able to embrace the truth of God's words. Habakkuk wants to know - How much longer will it be before God will intervene and put an end to all the evil and violence in the world? Why does God allow evil people to swallow up good people? Why do evil nations and people prosper? In his struggle, Habakkuk has a fresh realization of God's sovereignty - "The LORD is in His holy temple; let all the earth be silent before Him." (2:20) Habakkuk begins to realize that God works in ways that are beyond our comprehension – "I am going to do something in your days that you would not believe, even if you were told." (1:5) He receives fresh assurance that one day good will completely triumph over evil - "For the earth will be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the LORD as the waters cover the seas." (2:14) In light of this, the best way for a person to live is by entrusting themselves to God - "The just shall live by faith." (2:4) The author of the book of Hebrews quotes this verse to emphasize the believer's need to remain strong and faithful in the midst of affliction and trials - Hebrews 10:38. Paul quotes this same verse in Romans 1:17 & Galatians 3:11 to proclaim the incredible truth that we are justified before God through our faith. The Book of Habakkuk concludes with the powerful declaration that even when life is hard - the fig tree does not bud, no grapes on the vine, the olive crop fails, no food from the field, no sheep in the pen or cattle in the stalls - we still have a reason to rejoice in God who is our Savior. Our relationship with God is more important than anything else.

DEACON NOMINATIONS

Each member can nominate up to <u>five</u> church members to be considered for the Deacon Ministry. Those nominated will then be contacted to see if they are willing to serve if elected. The deadline for nominations is Sunday, **July 11**.

To be eligible for election to the office of deacon, a person must: (1) be a member of this church, and (2) have been a member of this church for a minimum of one year prior to election, and (3) be twenty one years of age or older, and (4) not be a paid staff member, and (5) not have served as an active deacon for the past twelve months.



They shall furthermore serve as a committee of discipline, exercising a special watch-care over the members of the church, & under the leadership of the pastor, make special effort to maintain spiritual harmony & righteous living among the membership of this church.


