In powerful and beautiful language we gain a glimpse of the lengths God has gone to provide salvation for us through His Son. Jesus Christ.

THE SYMBOL OF THE CROSS

The most distinguishing symbol of the Christian faith is the cross. We have grown accustomed to seeing the cross as jewelry, on steeples, or even on T-shirts. But if you think about it even a little – it is an odd choice as a symbol of our faith. It was a means of execution. A hangman's noose or an electric chair would be odd choices for jewelry.

This is even more amazing when we consider the horror & torture with which crucifixion was regarded in the ancient world. Crucifixion was invented by Persians, but taken over by the Greeks & perfected by the Romans. It is regarded as the cruelest method of execution ever practiced because it delayed death until the maximum torture had been inflicted on its victim. It was possible for the victim to hang on the cross for days before dying very slowly of asphyxiation. The Roman government considered crucifixion such a heinous form of execution that they did not allow any Roman citizens to be executed in this manner. Crucifixion was so painful and such a horrible way to be tortured and killed that a new word had to be created to describe it. The word "excruciating" was coined to attempt to describe the pain and agony of the cross. It literally means "out of the cross."


But, the cross does not just mean pain, torture, and death. The cross symbolizes God's love for us and the new life we can have through Him. Leave it to God to turn something as ugly as the cross into a beautiful symbol of love and life. As bad as things get... we can look to the cross and realize that evil does not have the last word. For that matter... death does not have the last word. The cross has become a symbol of God's victory over death. The Catholic tradition favors the crucifix - a dving Jesus on the cross. It is a reminder of His suffering and how He identifies with us in the midst of our suffering. He is with us. He comes to us and suffers with us, and this is extraordinarily powerful. The Protestant tradition favors the empty cross as a symbol not only of Jesus' death but also of His resurrection. He has risen from the dead. He has conquered sin, death, and the grave. Because He lives... We can live! The cross proclaims a love that is more powerful than death.

Look at the cross... and see your need for God. Look at the cross... and see the love and power of God. Let the cross be personal for you. Let it be a symbol of your salvation, of your forgiveness, of God's love for you, and of His power that is at work in your life. Let the cross be a symbol of your commitment to Christ. Let His mark be on your life and on your heart as you choose humility instead of pride, love instead of hate, and forgiveness instead of malice. The Cross of Christ calls us to live differently from the world. "May I never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, through which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world." Galatians 6:14


