Join us as we learn about a different book of the Bible each week and what it teaches us about Jesus. We meet in the Fellowship Hall practicing social distancing. We plan to live stream the study for those who are not able to be with us in person. It can be viewed live a little after 6:00 pm on Wednesdays or afterward at a time of your convenience.

March 17 – Isaiah \* March 24 – Jeremiah With 33.002 Hebrew words Jeremiah is the longest book of the Bible. (Genesis is second with 32,046 words and Psalms is third with 30,147 words.)

The author is Jeremiah, a prophet from Anathoth, a priestly community about 3 miles northeast of Jerusalem. His father's name was Hilkiah. He is the only prophet of the OT whom God forbade to marry. His name means "Yahweh exalts."

The book takes place during the final days of the nation of Judah and records its destruction by the Babylonians.

Jeremiah is known as the "weeping prophet." He warns the people of the coming destruction, but the people do not listen. He is surrounded by false prophets who preach what the people want to hear - peace, safety and victory.

Jeremiah is also the author of Lamentations, a collection of funeral dirges for Jerusalem that proclaim God's faithfulness.

Jeremiah endures mockery, death threats, imprisonment, and kidnapping from the people he is desperately trying to help.

Jeremiah's ministry began in the 13<sup>th</sup> year of Josiah in 626 BC and concluded when the temple was destroyed in 586 BC -40 years. The final paragraph of the book describes events that occurred in 560 BC, bringing the time period covered by the book to 66 years.

Jeremiah prophesied during the administrations of 5 of Judah's kings – Josiah (639-608 BC – 31 years): Jehoahaz (698 BC – 3 months); Jehoiakim (608-597 BC - 11 years); Johoiachin (597 BC - 3 months); and Zedekiah (597-586 BC - 11 years).

The book of Jeremiah is quoted or alluded to around 125 times in the New Testament. Jeremiah proclaims a new and everlasting covenant that will be written on our hearts.

While the book of Jeremiah contains many words of warning and righteous judgement, it also contains a powerful message of hope and a future from God who is constantly at work to bring redemption and salvation.




