IN HIS ARMS

Life is complicated and filled with the unexpected. Years ago a mother of eight, came home from a neighbor's one Saturday morning to find her five youngest children huddled together, concentrating intently on something. As she slipped near them, trying to discover the center of the attraction, she couldn't believe her eyes. Smack in the middle of the circle were several baby skunks. As calmly as she could she screamed for the children to run. And they did. Each kid grabbed a skunk and ran!

Trouble does seem to come in bunches. The ducks swarm around our heads. Jesus said, "In this world you will have trouble." John 16:33 In the Book of Job we find... "Man that is born of woman is a few days and full of trouble." Job 14:1 Dr. Klaus Festermann, an able German scholar who has done extensive study of the Hebrew says that the phrase "full of trouble" is the image of a parade. You stand watching a parade, and one segment goes by ... and another... and then another... "Man who is born of woman is of few days, and trouble passes before him like a parade." It is one thing after another.

Where is our refuge? Who is our strength? From whence cometh our help? If we are wise, we run to God's arms. As a child I remember the security of my parents' embrace. God longs to draw us into His everlasting, strong arms. God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. (Psalm 46:1) His rod, His staff they comfort me. (Psalm 23:4)

He is "The Father of compassion and the God of all comfort." 2 Corinthians 1:3 The English word "comfort" comes from two Latin words that together mean "with strength." The comfort of God is not a word of pity but of power. God's comfort does not weaken us; it strengthens us. God is not indulging us but empowering us.

I. God is greater than our Fears.

The admonition not to be afraid appears 365 times in the Bible. What God offers is not a hollow whistle in the dark, but a solid conviction that through Christ, "all fear is gone." There are times when nothing but faith will drive those dark doubts away. We can climb out of the lap of fear and into the arms of God and experience a peace that guards our hearts and minds.

II. God is greater than our Circumstances

Paul writes, "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love Him, who have been called according to His purpose." Romans 8:28 These verses are as important for what they do not say as they are for what they say: They do not say that everything that happens is good – it isn't. They do not say that everything will turn out okay for everyone – it won't. It does say that God is at work in the world, especially in the lives of His children. His glorious purpose is to make us like His Son, Jesus Christ. And to that end, God can and does use all things - the good and the bad - that which He causes and that which He only permits. The words "work together" – bring the idea of mixing chemicals in the right proportion for a healing effect.

III. God is greater than our Hearts.

As long as trouble and sorrow are absent from our lives, we can be proud and confident, egotistical and independent. But when our lives are troubled we may learn that we are creatures before the Creator, and we are dependent on Him. God is never so near as when we have come to the end of our resources. In the valleys of our dark moments we can learn that we are not gods but we are God's people. We are not independent beings but dependent personalities. We are not creators but creatures made by a Creator. We are not the captain of our soul but we have been redeemed by One who desires to be.

Do you know the comfort that comes from God? He is able to supply your needs. He is greater than our fears, greater than our circumstances, and greater than our hearts. Let Him draw you into His arms. Place yourselves in His hands. It requires faith and trust but there is no better place to live or to die. Let Him strengthen your heart right now.

Being used by God to share His love & to see someone receive Jesus as their Savior is one of life's greatest blessings. Believers often play a critical role in sharing God's word as the Holy Spirit draws people to Christ.

Pray for the Lost: Pray that God inspires the lost to seek out the true meaning of life. Pray that God reveals to them the origin of their spiritual discontent. Pray that God will surround them with reminders of His love and people who can help them. Pray that God gives them the courage to acknowledge and turn from their sin. Pray that God will grant them the humility to ask for His help.

Tell Your Story: As God's instrument be prepared to give the reason for the hope that you have and be willing to share your testimony so that others may experience the wondrous love of Jesus. Be honest about the impact the Lord has had in your life as you have grown in your relationship with Christ.

Be Patient and Understanding: Don't be disappointed if the person you are trying to lead to Christ isn't immediately moved by the Holy Spirit or doesn't show the response you expect after discovering the Word of God. You'll need to be patient and answer questions and continue to lift Jesus up until the person's heart is transformed by Christ. God often uses a multitude of different experiences in a person's life.

Nurture the New Believer: New believers need your help to grow in spiritual maturity and become multiplying disciples themselves who bring others to Christ. Pray for new believers and ask God to work in their lives and solidify their new convictions and beliefs. Read the Bible together and share your knowledge of the Gospel. Introduce new believers to other Christians who can provide additional support and guidance in this new phase of their life. Encourage new believers to talk about how God has changed their lives.

Personal Evangelism Tools: Participating in the practice of personal evangelism doesn't require anything more than an open heart and the Word of God, but it may be helpful to become familiar with a couple of useful resources. 
