Called Church Conference WHAT'S IN YOUR HEART?

As Jesus and the disciples gather for the Passover meal they come to the table with many different things in their hearts. Jesus knows it is their last night together before His death and so He "shows them the full extent of His love." (John 13:1) His disciples argue over which of them is the greatest. (Luke 22:24) Jesus washes each of the disciple's feet including Peter's and Judas's (John 13:2-11) and teaches them to follow His example. (John 13:12-17: Luke 22:25-30) He warns them that one of them will betray Him and they question who this could be. (Mark 14:19; Matthew 26:25; Luke 22:23; John 13:22-25) Jesus quotes the prophecy (Psalm 41:9) about the one who will betray Him and identifies Judas discreetly (John 13:28) through an intimate and loving act of shared bread. (John 13:26) As they celebrate the Passover, Jesus begins a new covenant that is based in His broken body and shed blood. (Matthew 26:26-29; Mark 14:22-25; Luke 22:19-20) Jesus tells the disciples, calling Simon Peter by name, that Satan has asked to sift them like wheat. (Luke 22:31) He tells Peter that He has prayed for him that his faith may not fail and that after he has turned back he can strengthen his brothers. (Luke 22:32) He then tells Peter that before the rooster crows, he will deny Him three times. (Luke 22:34; John 13:38) He gives them all a new commandment - "As I have loved you, so you must love one another" (John 13:34) and tells them that this is how they will be identified as being His disciples.


