CALLED CHURCH CONFERENCE

Next Sunday, April 11 * After the Morning Service We will consider a recommendation from the Property Committee and the Deacons that the church employ *Bonitz* to replace the flooring in the sanctuary and fovers at a cost of \$74,720.00; that we employ Premier Pew Padding to replace the upholstery at a cost of \$27,980.00; and that we employ B & H Acoustics Inc to replace the ceilings in the foyers at a cost of \$10,810.00. A display will be set up with samples of the proposed materials. The Property Committee is in the process of receiving bids and hope to be able to present a recommendation soon to replace the lighting in the foyers and the flooring in the office area. Funds for these projects will come from the contributions to our Over and Above Project and from a gift from Michiko Phillips' Estate.

WALKING THROUGH THE BIBLE

March 31 – Lamentations * April 7– Ezekiel

In 605 BC King Nebuchadnezzar began the conquest of Jerusalem. He took many articles from the temple and many captives including Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah. Eight years later in 597 BC, King Jehoiachin was taken captive along with a group of 10,000 people which included a 25 year old from a family of priests named Ezekiel. "Ezekiel" means "strengthened by God." Ezekiel was a contemporary of Jeremiah and Daniel. Jeremiah was about 20 years older and remained in Jerusalem before he was kidnapped and taken to Egypt. Daniel became a member of Nebuchadnezzar's court in Babylon.

Ezekiel and his wife lived in a farming community with other exiles around Tel-Abib, southeast of Babylon, on the bank of the Chebar River. His prophetic ministry began in 593 BC and extended at least until 570 BC. False prophets deceived many exiles with the promise of a speedy return to Judah. Ezekiel warned the people that Jerusalem would be destroyed and that they would remain in exile for an extended period. After Jerusalem and the temple were destroyed in 586 BC, Ezekiel prophesied about the future restoration of their homeland and of the blessings that would one day come in the Messiah's Kingdom.

Ezekiel uses visions, prophecies, parables, signs, & symbols to proclaim & dramatize God's message to His exiled people. The book begins with an incredible vision of the Living Creatures, wheels within wheels, & of God seated on His throne. The vision proclaims that God is not just sovereign in Judah but is also the God of the exiles & is in fact the God of all places & all times.

Another famous vision is about a valley of dry bones. Ezekiel is told to preach to the bones & watches as they reattach & are covered with skin. He is told to preach a second time & this time God breathes life into them forming a mighty army. What God does to the dry bones He is more than able to do in the lives of His people.

In another prophecy, God's people are sheep who have become harassed & helpless. God is going to fire their shepherds, & He, Himself, will bind the injured, strengthen the weak, & rescue the strays. He will destroy the strong fat sheep who have kept the weak from being strengthened. He will send them a new Shepherd, the Messiah, from the line of David. Jesus is the fulfillment of this promise. He is the Good Shepherd who lays down His life for the sheep.




