WHO IS ON TRIAL?

Jesus' trial reveals who He is but it also reveals the evil in our hearts.

Who had Jesus arrested?

What kind of people were they?

Why did they want to kill Jesus?

He healed on the Sabbath and claimed to be Lord of the Sabbath; He associated with sinners: He did not follow man made religious laws: He claimed to be able to forgive sins; He performed miracles through an unknown power; He exposed their hypocrisy and outwitted them in public debate; He disrupted activity at the temple and seemed to speak against the temple; He drew large crowds which threatened the peace; they saw Him as a threat to stability and their position of authority. He was not the Messiah they wanted Him to be.

Religious charge: Blasphemy for He claimed to be the Messiah, the Son of Man

Political charges: Subverting the nation, Opposing taxes, claiming to be a King
