WHAT WILL YOU DO WITH JESUS?

Matthew 27:1-2, 11-26; Mark 15:1-15

Luke 23:1-25; John 18:28 – 19:16

Pilate attempts to send Jesus back to the religious authorities. They protested that Jesus was worthy of death and that they did not have the legal right to execute anyone. John 18:28-32

Pilate sends Jesus to Herod, who was in Jerusalem for Passover, because Jesus was from Galilee which was under Herod's jurisdiction. Luke 23:1-12

Pilate interviews Jesus and then **proclaims His innocence** before the crowd. The crowd demands that Jesus be crucified. John 18:33-38; 19:9-12; Luke 23:1-5; 13-16

Pilate is warned by his wife, "Don't have anything to do with that innocent man." Matthew 27:19

Pilate tries to release Jesus according to Passover custom but the crowd demands that Barabbas be released and Jesus be crucified.

Mark 15:1-15; Matthew 27:11-23; Luke 23:13-25; John 18:39-40

Pilate has Jesus scourged. Matthew 27:26; Mark 15:15; John 19:1
Roman scourging often resulted in deep lacerations, torn flesh, exposed organs, and excessive bleeding which would leave the person "half-dead."

Pilate presents Jesus to the crowd severely beaten, wearing a crown of thorns & purple robe **hoping the crowd will have compassion on Him** & allow Him to be released. The crowd tells Pilate, "If you let this man go, you are no friend of Caesar. Anyone who claims to be a king opposes Caesar." John 19:1-16

Pilate washes his hands of responsibility. "I am innocent of this man's blood," he said. "It is your responsibility!" All the people answered, "His blood is on us and our children." Matthew 27:24-26
