May 12 – Obadiah May 19 – Jonah

The prophet Jonah was from Gath Hepher near Nazareth in Galilee (2 Kings 14:25.) He lived during a time of financial peace and prosperity characterized by a weak and adulterous devotion to God. The story takes place just prior to the time of

God commands Jonah to preach to the people of Nineveh, the capital of the Assyrian Empire. Forty years later Assyria will destroy Israel (722 BC.) Nineveh will be destroyed about 150 years from the time of Jonah's preaching by the Babylonians and Medes (612 BC.) The book of Jonah reminds us that God is the God of all creation and of all nations. He cares deeply for everyone He has created (even those who do not know their right hand from their left.) Jonah knows that God is gracious, compassionate, slow to anger, and abounding in love. Jonah does not want to preach to the people of Nineveh because he fears that they will repent and that God will spare the city. In many ways Jonah represents the people of God. We have been chosen and commissioned by God to be His witnesses. We rebel against His will, yet have been miraculously preserved by God through the centuries to finally share His truth. The reluctance of God's people is contrasted in the book of Jonah with the eagerness of the sailors and the people of Nineveh to turn to God. The book illustrates God's sovereign power to bring about His will. God prepares (appoints / ordains) a great fish, a plant, a worm, and a scorching east wind to give Jonah the opportunity to change his heart. The book ends with God asking a question that demonstrates His great compassion. Through the centuries people have questioned the miracles in the book of Jonah particularly that Jonah is able to survive for 3 days in the belly of a great fish. But if God can create the heavens and the earth (Genesis 1:1) He is more than capable of preparing a great fish. Jesus refers to the story of Jonah as a historical account and tells us that "The men of Nineveh will stand up at the judgment with this generation and condemn it; for they repented at the preaching of Jonah, and now something greater than Jonah is here." Matthew 12:41 Jesus will refer to His death and resurrection (3 days in the tomb) as the "Sign of Jonah." Artists have illustrated this truth by showing Jonah being expelled from the great fish beside Jesus being expelled from the tomb.




