Oct 13 – Philippians **Oct 20 – Colossians**

Colossians, Philemon and Ephesians were written around the same time, while Paul is in prison in Rome c. 62 AD, and delivered by Tychicus. The Colossians first heard the good news about Jesus from Epaphras who is with Paul in prison. The main theme of the letter is the supremacy and complete sufficiency of Jesus the Christ.

- Jesus is fully God & is the image of the invisible God. He is before all things, supreme over all things and the one who holds all things together. Everything was created through Jesus and for Jesus. 15-17, 19
- He is the head of the Church and the first of those resurrected to eternal life from the dead. 1:18
- Through His blood shed on the cross, He has brought reconciliation & peace so that we can be presented holy, without blemish and free from accusation. 1:20, 22
- In Christ is hidden all the treasures of wisdom & knowledge. 2:3
- Our relationship with Christ begins when we receive Him as our Lord, but it continues as our lives are rooted, built up, and strengthened in our faith in Him which overflows with thankfulness. 2:6-7
- Christ frees us from the hollow and deceptive philosophies that depend on human tradition and elemental spiritual forces. 2:8
- All of God’s fullness lives in bodily form in Christ. 2:9
- He is over every power and authority. 2:10
- God has made us alive with Christ, forgiven our sins & canceled our debts by nailing them to the cross, triumphing over other powers and authorities. 2:13-15
- The festivals, new moon celebrations and even the Sabbath day itself were a “shadow” of the reality that is found in Christ. 2:16-17
- Those who worship angels, elemental spiritual forces or have imposed commands of human origin have lost their connection to the truth found in Christ. 2:18-23
- Christ is our very life and so our minds can be set on things above and we can put to death those things that belong to our earthly nature. 3:1-9
- We can be renewed & clothed in Christ’s characteristics & look forward to appearing with Him in glory. 3:4, 12-17
- In Christ, racial & economic barriers are overcome. 3:11
- Christ changes how we act as husbands & fathers, wives, children, slaves and masters. 3:18-4:1
- We need to make the most of every opportunity to share Christ. Even ordinary conversations should be filled with grace and seasoned with salt and the answers found in Christ. 4:5-6

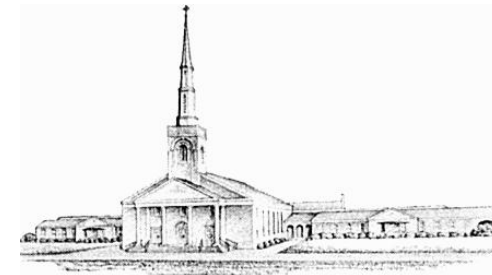
