September 8 – Romans **September 1** – Acts **September 15** – 1 Corinthians

Romans: Paul wrote a letter to the Church in Rome around 57 AD from Corinth toward the close of his Third Missionary Journey. At the time Paul wrote the letter, he had not vet been to Rome. He writes to teach the great truths of the gospel of grace and hopes that the Church in Rome will be able to help him with his planned ministry to Spain (15:28.) Romans is the longest of Paul's letters, provides the fullest expression of Paul's theology, and clearly explains why we need salvation.

- Everyone has sinned against God. (3:23)
- God loves us and sent His Son to die for us. (5:8)
- Sin brings death but God's gift is eternal life through Christ Jesus our Lord. (6:23)
- If we confess with our mouths Jesus is Lord and believe in our hearts that God raised Him from the dead we will be saved. (10:9)

Like most of Paul's letters the main body of the letter is divided into two parts - a teaching section and a practical application section. Paul teaches us how the Gospel reveals God's righteousness, creates a new humanity, fulfills God's promise to Israel and unifies the Church.

1 Corinthians: Paul wrote this letter to the Church at Corinth around 54-56 AD from Ephesus during his Third Missionary Journey. Paul had helped plant the Church at Corinth a few years earlier during his Second Missionary Journey and lived in Corinth for 18 months (Acts 18:11.) In the letter Paul addresses some major problems in the church: divisions, sexual immorality, how to handle food sacrificed to idols, issues related to their worship gatherings and disbelief in Jesus' resurrection. Paul will define a problem and then respond to the issues with the Gospel - teaching us that the Gospel effects every area of our lives and every area of the Church. He gives a powerful description of love (chapter 13) that provides core principles as the gospel is applied to each issue. He gives an incredible description of the Church, the Body of Christ, which is diverse in Spiritual Gifts yet unified as one body in Christ (chapter 12.) He provides a detailed account of Jesus' resurrection appearances (chapter 15) which include Jesus appearing to more than 500 people at the same time and helps us to understand how Jesus' resurrection impacts our daily lives. 1 Corinthians is filled with practical truths that show us the centrality of love as we seek to live out the Gospel.
