

# WALKING THROUGH THE BIBLE

**September 22 - 2 Corinthians:** Paul wrote this letter to the Church at Corinth around 56 AD near the end of his Third Missionary Journey possibly

from Philippi. Paul had helped plant the Church at Corinth a few years earlier during his Second Missionary Journey and lived in Corinth for 18 months (Acts 18:11.) Although we refer to the letter as "2 Corinthians" it is part of a larger body of correspondence between Paul and the church. (1 Corinthians 5:9 and 2 Corinthians 2:4 refer to letters that are not included in our New Testament.) 2 Corinthians is a deeply personal letter. Paul opens his heart to the Corinthians, shares his motivations for ministry, and includes many details about his suffering and life (that appear only here in the New Testament) as he responds to those who are critical of him. Themes include: God's comfort, the ministry of reconciliation, the new covenant, what it means to be a new creation in Christ, the way God uses and redeems both our suffering and our weaknesses, our new bodies, the dangers of idolatry, the blessings of generosity, discernment, true and false apostles, and God's grace that is truly sufficient for us. Paul tells us that he pleaded with God to remove a thorn in his flesh - an instrument of Satan that Paul felt hindered his ministry. God did not remove the thorn but instead said, "My grace is sufficient for you, for My power is made perfect in weakness." 12:9 And so Paul writes to encourage us that God will sometimes use our weaknesses more than our strengths, "That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong." 12:10
